First Generation

1. GODDIN, Unknown.

Note: The family name Goddin was no doubt originally Godwin back in the British Isles and in the colonial period of this country, but the spelling eventually changed to reflect the pronunciation. Some census records given the spelling as Godden. However, in order to avoid confusion, I have used "Goddin" throughout this database.--WCH, 17 Aug. 2005.

Note: Some Goddins/Godwins, including the below-named Berry Godwin, appear in North Carolina census records in 1830 and 1840 in Columbus County, next door to Robeson County, where a group of mixed-race people lived and have been known at various times as Cherokee, Croatan, or Lumbee Indians. I have not yet had opportunity to research very far into the Carolina origins of my Holmes County Goddins, but I wonder if there is any connection with the Godwins mentioned in this extract from a 1925 Robeson County court case:

"APPEAL by the defendants from Grady, J., at May Term, 1925, of Robeson.

Petition for the sale of land for partition heard upon the following agreed statement of facts: That Ned Faulk and Maria Faulk were slaves belonging to Col. Hinnard Faulk and that they lived together as man and wife during slavery. That it is admitted that such cohabitation by slavery was not recognized as a legal marriage under the law;

that this cohabitation continued until about 1857; that about that year Ned Faulk was sold as a slave to a person living in Alabama and was carried by such purchaser to Alabama and never returned; that to the above cohabitation the following named children were born prior to the time that Ned Faulk was sold and carried to Alabama: Beadie Faulk, Isham Faulk, Archie Faulk, Letzy Faulk, Miles Faulk; Tom Godwin; that Tom Godwin was originally a Faulk, but was given by Col. Faulk to his son-in-law, Berry Godwin, and thereafter Tom Faulk took the name of Tom Godwin. That the above-named full brothers and sisters of Tom Godwin died previous to the said Tom Godwin and some time after 1885, and before 1900; that the above-named brothers and sisters of Tom Godwin each left legitimate children born in lawful wedlock; and that these children and their heirs, and their lawful issue, are named and set forth in the amended petition filed in this cause, and, as such children, claim to be heirs at law of Tom Godwin, as their uncle and great uncle, and claim the property described in the petition."

Note: According to a RootsWeb family tree, the above-mentioned Berry or Barry Godwin "was born 1828, and died 1907. He married Martha E Faulk 27 AUG 1854 in Robeson Co., NC, daughter of Hinnant Faulk and Rosanna Lee. She was born 1835 in Robeson Co., NC, and died 1906 in Lumberton, Robeson Co., NC." Barry was the son of Simon Godwin and Cherry Renfro.

According to another RootsWeb tree, Hinnant Faulk's sister Elizabeth, b. abt. 1777, m. Jesse Godwin in Johnston Co., N. Car.

According to yet another RootsWeb tree, one Joel Faulk, b. 1775 Johnston Co., d. 1854 Columbus Co., " registered a will dated 17 Oct 1834 taken from Abstracts of Wills, Columbus Co NC 1808-1919 page 18 as follows: Daughter Maris Faulk, two feather beds and \$30.00, Daughters Thany Godwin, Pencie Strickland, Jennet Cribb and Maris Faulk, equal division of all his estate real and personal. . . . [But made] another will dated 12 May 1854 taken from Abstract of Wills, Columbus Co., NC 1808-1919 p 70 as follows: Wife Matilda Faul, cow and calf and \$4.00 in money. Daughter Bethany Godwin (wife of Simon Godwin), negro boy named Redick. This "negro boy" could not be my Reddick Goddin, who was 25 years old, married with children, and living in Holmes Co., Florida, in 1854; but the slave boy might have been named after someone in my Reddick's family. --WCH, 11 Sept. 2005.

2. **Nancy Jane GODDIN**^{1,2,3,4,5} () was born⁶ about 1827 in , , North Carolina.

Note: A correspondent who is a descendant of Bithel Haines Callahan asserts that his wife was a Goddin and possibly sister of Reddick. I am assuming, without proof, that Nancy Jane was indeed Reddick's sister, since the two couples, Callahan and Goddin, were living next door to each other in 1850, and were all born in North Carolina; nearby is Martin Callahan and family, whom I assume, also without proof, was the father of Bithel Haines. The scenario of two brothers marrying two sisters was a common one at that time--WCH, 11 Aug. 2005.

Nancy married **Bethel Haines CALLAHAN**^{7,8,9,10,11} son of Martin CALLAHAN and Cealy. Bethel was born about 1825 in , , North Carolina.

Note: Spelling of first and middle names is uncertain.

Note: According to E. W. Carswell in "Holmesteading," B. H. Callahan was mentioned in the "Florida State Gazetteer" in 1885 as one of the cotton and grain planters living near Westville.--WCH, 17 Aug. 2005

The 1st Regiment, Florida Cavalry, it says, was "Authorized by Gen. Banks October 29, 1863, and organized at Barrancas, Fla., December, 1863, to August, 1864. Attached to Pensacola, Fla., District West Florida, Dept. Gulf, to October, 1864. 2nd Brigade, District West Florida, to January, 1865. 3rd Brigade, District West Florida, to March, 1865. 2nd Brigade, Lucas' Cavalry Division, Steele's Command, to May, 1865. District of West Florida to November, 1865."

Reddick married³² (2) **Elizabeth BRAXTON**^{28,29,30,31} daughter of Oliver A. BRAXTON and Mary J. HEWITT about 1875. Elizabeth was born³³ about 1858 in , , Florida. She died after 1910.

Note: On the 1910 Holmes census, Ponce de Leon, Elizabeth Goddin, age 52, widowed, is living next to Mack Goddin and family. Mack's father is shown as born in North Carolina, so that seems to confirm that he is Reddick's son. Elizabeth is shown as mother of 3 children, all living; so I am assuming that the last 3 children of Reddick's (Fred, Rhoda, and Mack) are Elizabeth's. That means Reddick's first wife, Eleanor, died between 1872, when daughter Nancy was born, and 1876, when Fred was born.--WCH, 11 Aug. 2005.

Note: Acc. to family notes in my possession on the Bland and Goddin families, Elizabeth Braxton was stepmother to Nancy Goddin Bland.--WCH, 15 Aug. 2005.

Rhoda married^{44,45,46,47} **Stephen COOLEY** "Steve"^{39,40,41,42,43} son of Gillis COOLEY and Martha FOUNTAIN on 5 Feb 1904. Stephen was born^{48,49} about Feb 1885 in , , Florida. He died⁵⁰ in 1967.

Simon married^{60,61} (1) **Permeliann HALL** "Milly Ann"^{56,57,58,59} daughter of John Randolf HALL and Ann Caroline Luvicy COLLINS about 1872. Permeliann was born⁶² about 1854 in , , Alabama. She died⁶³ before 1920.

Piety married^{105,106,107} **Ely COLLINSWORTH**^{102,103,104} about 1873. Ely was born^{108,109,110} in 1840 in , , Alabama.

Note: There is a chance this Ely (first name hard to read on 1900 Fla., Holmes, Westville census), b. 1840, is the same as Eli, b. 1849, son of William J. and Rachael Collinsworth on censuses in 1850 Coffee Co., Ala., and 1870 Walton Co., Fla. but not enough data at this time to prove the link. Could be there are two men named "Eli/Ely" I am getting mixed up here, though.--WCH, 13 Aug. 2005.

Cemetery, Holmes, Florida.

Note: On the 1910 Holmes (Ponce de Leon) census, Trudie is shown as being in her second marriage, to Eddie Broxton, with one daughter, Eunice Thomas, age 2.

On 1920 Holmes (Westville) census, Trudie is shown as Trudie Thomas, widow, with daughters Eunice Collinsworth, age 12, and Lecie Thomas, age 1 4/12. Two doors away are a Samuel R. Thomas, age 59, and wife Adeline, age 75, both born in Georgia, with nephew Clarence Ernest, age 15, b. Fla.; but nothing to indicate they are related to Trudie or her daughters.

On 1930 Holmes (Ponce de Leon) census, Trudie is shown with new husband Oscar Couch, 38, and his 3 children by previous wife; Lecie, age 12, is also in the home, but Eunice is not. Also present are two "lodgers," Monroe and Thelma Andrews, ages 6 and 3 1/2, both born Alabama.

On this census, Oscar's age at first marriage is shown as 27, which correlates with the age of his oldest child; Trudie's age at first marriage is given as 14, which would be about 1901, six years before Eunice was born.

Trudie is buried at Westville Cemetery: COLLINSWORTH, Trudie, b. Apr 15 1887 d. Sep 25 1933 (from cemetery survey posted on Holmes County GenWeb site).

Looking at all the above, it's hard to tell when (or if) Trudie was married to James Thomas and the unknown Collinsworth. It's possible that one of these two last names was Trudie's maiden name. But Eunice Thomas Bland Sims did claim Harmon Thomas as her half-brother or step-brother.--WCH, 13 Aug. 2005.

Note: See notes under James E. Thomas for record of 1907 marriage with Willie G. Collinsworth; I have also found record of the 1909 marriage to E. C. Broxton.--WCH, 6 Sept. 2005.

Note: A correspondent writes, "Asberry Thomas was married to Trudie Collinsworth Thomas Broxton. She had 2 maybe 3 daughters, one of which was with the Asberry union. Trudie's brother Rufus is the one who murdered him in 1919."--WCH, 14 Sept. 2005.

Willie married¹³² (1) **James E. THOMAS** "Jim"^{128,129,130,131} on 26 Apr 1907. James was born¹³³ in Jan 1854 in , , Florida. He died after 1910.

Note: In the 1880 Holmes census, a James Thomas, 25, b. Fla., parents b. Ala., is shown married to a Georgiann or Georgiana, age 22, b. Fla., parents b. Ala. James is apparently marked Mulatto but it is a little difficult to read; Georgiann is White. Not sure if that James is the same as the James Thomas found in Berry Thomas's household in 1860 Holmes census or not; also not sure if it is the same person as the James E. Thomas described below, but that is a tempting possibility.

In 1900 Walton census, White male J. E. Thomas, b. Jan 1854, b. Fla., parents b. Fla. and Ga., is shown with wife Rhoda J., b. Fla., parents b. N. C. and Fla. However, it is unclear how old Rhoda is here: the census taker put her age as 20, but her birth as July 1869.

In this same 1900 census, there are three children, Washington, Herman, and Lula May, ages 9, 7, and 2, respectively, all b. Fla., parents b. Fla. However, the record clearly shows that J. E. and Rhoda have been married 5 years. Yet Rhoda is shown as mother of 1 child, with none living. All of this is very confused; it is not at all clear who the mother of these children is, or how long this couple has been married.

According to one correspondent, James Thomas married Patsey Goddin (b. abt 1869), not Rhoda; is it possible that Patsey died sometime in the late 1890's, and James subsequently married her sister, Rhoda?

The 1910 Holmes census (Ponce de Leon) shows Steve and Rhody Cooley, no ages shown, living next door to both Steve's mother Mother, and also Reddick Goddin's widow, Elizabeth. In that census, Rhody or Rhoda is shown as mother of no children.

Possibly there are two different Rhodas here; one of them is surely Rhoda Goddin, but which one? However, another correspondent says that Rhoda married Steve Cooley, who subsequently deserted her and fled to Mississippi without a divorce and had children there by Dora Glass, also from Holmes County.

All very confusing; more research needed here. I am strongly tempted to assume, though without proof, that this James is the same as the James who was brother to Berry Thomas; it is a fact that son Harmon attended the so-called Dominicker school circa 1910-1915; and there is

no other way to account for that, since Harmon's other ancestry was Goddin and Callahan, all counted as White as far as I know at this time.--WCH, 13 Aug. 2005.

Note: Acc. to family notes in my possession on the Bland and Goddin families, "Patsy Goddin married Jim Thomas, Harmon's mother and father."--WCH, 15 Aug. 2005.

Note: According to a transcript of Holmes County Marriage Book I, 1902-1909, which I found today on the Holmes County GenWeb site, James E. Thomas married Willie G. [for Gertrude?] Collinsworth on 26 April 1907.--WCH, 6 Sept. 2005.

Willie married^{136,137,138} (2) **Edward C. BROXTON** "Eddie"^{134,135} son of Andrew BROXTON and Lurah A. on 16 Jan 1909. Edward was born¹³⁹ about 1885 in , , Florida. He died¹⁴⁰ before 1920.

Edward was employed as laborer in 1910 in a saw mill.

Note: Birthdate for Eddie is given in 1900 Holmes census as Aug. 1883.--WCH, 13 Aug. 2005.

Willie married¹⁴⁴ (3) **Asberry THOMAS**^{141,142,143} son of Christian THOMAS before 1918. Asberry was born¹⁴⁵ about Oct 1894 in , , Florida. He died¹⁴⁶ on 30 Sep 1919 in Westville, Holmes, Florida.

Note: listed as son of Berry Thomas on 1900 Holmes (Westville) census, but as he was 73 and widowed, I think it more likely that Asberry is son of Christian.

Note also that I am assuming without proof that Asberry is the Berry Thomas mentioned in the following article.--WCH, 14 Aug. 2005.

Next door to the Forehands is Berry Thomas, 57, Mulatto, with wife Mary, 43, White; daughter Christian, 16, White; Benjamin Hall, stepson to Berry, age 21, White; also boarder Louis Carnelly, 26, and wife Rutha (?), 19, both White.

On the other side of the Forehands is the family of William Bland, 34, White, and wife Martha, 44, Mulatto. All the children are listed as Mulatto: stepdaughter Clarkie, 21; Ginnie, 15; William, 13; Viola, 9; John, 4; Sarah, 1. The elder William is shown as born in Florida, both parents in Georgia; Martha and both her parents are shown born in Georgia. All of William and Martha's children are shown born in Florida.--WCH, 11 Aug. 2005.

The sheriff would wait till the next day, ride his horse or horse and buggy over there, ask a few questions, and if the motive wasn't obvious, he would return to Bonifay, and that would be the end of it. Sometimes, though, the local men or the victim's family would take matters into their own hands, such as was the case when the black turpentine worker molested and killed the little Morrison girl near Leonia in 1910."

James is apparently marked Mulatto but it is a little difficult to read; Georgiann is White. Not sure if that James is the same as the James Thomas found in Berry Thomas's household in 1860 Holmes census or not; also not sure if it is the same person as the James E. Thomas described below, but that is a tempting possibility.

In 1900 Walton census, White male J. E. Thomas, b. Jan 1854, b. Fla., parents b. Fla. and Ga., is shown with wife Rhoda J., b. Fla., parents b. N. C. and Fla. However, it is unclear how old Rhoda is here: the census taker put her age as 20, but her birth as July 1869.

In this same 1900 census, there are three children, Washington, Herman, and Lula May, ages 9, 7, and 2, respectively, all b. Fla., parents b. Fla. However, the record clearly shows that J. E. and Rhoda have been married 5 years. Yet Rhoda is shown as mother of 1 child, with none living. All of this is very confused; it is not at all clear who the mother of these children is, or how long this couple has been married.

According to one correspondent, James Thomas married Patsey Goddin (b. abt 1869), not Rhoda; is it possible that Patsey died sometime in the late 1890's, and James subsequently married her sister, Rhoda?

The 1910 Holmes census (Ponce de Leon) shows Steve and Rhody Cooley, no ages shown, living next door to both Steve's mother Mother, and also Reddick Goddin's widow, Elizabeth. In that census, Rhody or Rhoda is shown as mother of no children.

Possibly there are two different Rhodas here; one of them is surely Rhoda Goddin, but which one?

However, another correspondent says that Rhoda married Steve Cooley, who subsequently deserted her and fled to Mississippi without a divorce and had children there by Dora Glass, also from Holmes County.

All very confusing; more research needed here. I am strongly tempted to assume, though without proof, that this James is the same as the James who was brother to Berry Thomas; it is a fact that son Harmon attended the so-

called Dominicker school circa 1910-1915; and there is no other way to account for that, since Harmon's other ancestry was Goddin and Callahan, all counted as White as far as I know at this time.--WCH, 13 Aug. 2005.

Daughter Ada Bland Williams was the informant; she may have been relying on a family tradition of Irish ancestry, is what I believe.--WCH, 15 Aug. 2005.

Johnny was well known for his fiddle playing and often played at dances around Holmes County. In the 1920's, he played live on the air for early radio station WCOA in Pensacola.

As a teenager or young man, Johnny lived for a time with an older sister in Montgomery, Alabama, where he took violin lessons from a master violinist who had studied in Europe. While in Montgomery, Johnny worked as a call boy for one of the railroads; in that day before everyone had a telephone, call boys were used to go around to the homes or boarding houses where engineers and other railroad employees lived to let them know when they were supposed to report for duty.

At a later time, Johnny worked in the Louisville and Nashville Railroad shops in Mobile, Alabama, for a year or two, making at first a dollar a day, later raised to a dollar and a quarter. However, when his father died in 1908, Johnny returned home to Westville to provide a home for his widowed mother. Johnny also worked for some time as fireman on a steam locomotive on a logging railroad somewhere near Westville.

In the early 1920's, Johnny got a civil service job at the Naval Air Station in Pensacola, operating the steam boilers that served the heating system at the Naval Hospital there. Wife

Huey Bland, Filled with "Moonshine," Stabs Bill Odom, Causing His Death

Fatal Cutting Scrape Near Ponce De Leon Sunday Night, Bland In Jail.

Bill Odom is dead and Huey Bland is in the county jail here charged with murder as the outcome of a cutting scrape, three miles southeast of Ponce de Leon.

Odom was stabbed several times, the principal wound being a deep stab over the left nipple and a gash several inches long in the stomach. He lived from 9 o'clock. Bland was not hurt. He made his escape after the cutting, but was later caught by Will Skinner and landed in the Ponce de Leon town jail at Ponce de Leon. He was brought to Bonifay Monday and lodged in the county jail, the coroner's jury, which was empaneled by county judge Belser, returning a verdict charging him with murder. The coroner's jury was composed of the following men: A. Hussey, Jack Paul, Hurdis Green, Toom Hobbs, W. E. Parish and John M. Hall. They made as thorough investigation as was possible with the result as told above.

The killing occurred on the public road directly in front of the home of J. B. Moody. There were several men in the party and all hands were "tanked up" on moonshine whiskey, it is said. According to members of the party, Odom and Bland had dropped back in the rear and soon cries for help were heard. They rushed back and found Odom lying on he ground and crying out he had been killed. Bland had disappeared down the road.

Both Odom and Bland are married men, the latter having a wife an two children.

Travis was treacherously shot in the back by a friend in Holmes County and died a few days later. I seem to recall hearing that he actually died at his sister Mandy Hood's home in Pensacola, but here is an article from the Pensacola newspaper (no date):

GUNSHOT VICTIM'S CONDITION SERIOUS

The condition of Travis Bland, 32, who was shot and seriously wounded near Westville Sunday, was reported still critical at Pensacola hospital late last night. Bland was brought to the hospital late Sunday night. He had been shot in the back with a .38 calibre revolver, the bullet passing completely through his body.

According to information received here Bland was shot during a quarrel with J. C. Callahan, of Westville. Callahan is reported being held in the Bonifay jail pending the outcome of Bland's wound.
